

Call for Award Nominations for the Society for Prevention Research

ECPN John B. Reid Early Career Award

This award is presented annually by the Early Career Preventionist Network (ECPN) to a person early in their career in prevention. This award will be bestowed on someone who has shown a commitment to prevention science through outstanding contributions to research, policy, or practice. The award is presented at the Society for Prevention Research Annual Meeting Awards Presentation and Reception.

Eligibility:

- Nominee must be an early career scientist, defined as within 10 years post terminal degree.
- Nominee must be a member of the Society for Prevention Research at the time of nomination.

Nomination Process:

- Complete nomination packet includes nominator's supporting statement, an additional letter of endorsement, and the nominee's curriculum vitae.
- Nominator's supporting statement should address the nominee's contribution to the field of prevention science as evidenced by their activities in research, policy, service, and/or teaching. The strongest letters will include an indication of the potential long-term significance and impact of candidate's activities on the field of prevention science.
- The letter of endorsement may be less encompassing but should address similar themes.
