Dear SPR abstract presenter,

We hope this e-mail finds you and yours healthy and safe.

We apologize for the delay in sending the abstract acceptance notices for the SPR 2021 virtual conference. It took longer than anticipated to complete the first stage of the review process which includes the double-blind review by three reviewers for each abstract and the score analysis to be completed. We are now in the second stage of the abstract review process which is the work of the abstract theme review committees. We are working towards sending the notices out by April 11.

The SPR 2021 Annual Meeting “Addressing Racism and Disparities when Considering Biology and Context” will be held virtually June 2–4, 2021. All sessions will be live in a Zoom environment. This includes the plenary sessions, the invited symposia, and all of the concurrent, breakout sessions, and the poster presentations. We will provide detailed presentation instructions.

The conference committee is assembling an exciting three days of intellectually stimulating plenary sessions and invited symposia within the context of a global pandemic and increased focus on public health and health equity across the world.
